Terms of Reference are meant to provide the framework for a committee outlining the role, mission, responsibilities, and composition of the committee.

The role of the committee was set as part of the creation of the Committee in March of 2021. The current Committee has expressed that they wish to expand its role from what was originally stated when the committee was created, this verbiage has been updated to ensure the role of the committee is clearly identified.

The Committee commented on having specifics for membership of various groups within the TOR, however this can be very limiting to a Committee when recruiting new members. It is advisable to instead, with the assistance of the committee, provide robust advertising for new members, through options such as social media, traditional ads in newspapers and possibly targeted emails to groups.
