- Agricultural Awareness Barn Featuring live animals and knowledgeable presenters, this exhibit is open for the duration of the fair and connects attendees to the heart of rural life and farming practices.
- **Saturday Morning Parade** A vibrant tradition featuring a record-breaking 36 float entries in 2024, bringing the community together in a celebratory display of local pride.
